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## Activities

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### **Speaking, Listening and Viewing/ Problem Solving, Reasoning and Creative Thinking**

- Look over the collage of newspaper headlines from Antonina Uccello's tenure as Hartford's first female mayor. What do they tell you about her world? Do you think the headlines tell a story? Be imaginative and write the story you see in these headlines.

### **Working Independently and Collaboratively/Speaking, Listening and Viewing**

- In small groups, gather headlines about a female politician in our time. Create a collage of headlines. Write a story to go with the headlines and present your team's collage and the story to the class.

### **Quantifying/ Reading/ Writing/ Learning Resources and Information Technology**

- Antonina Uccello was the first female mayor of Hartford. The mayor is only one part of local government. Who were the other members of local government at the time? Do some research on your own city or town. Find out what the positions are and who holds them. As a class create a flow chart.

### **Learning Resources and Information Technology**

- Research women in government in the state of Connecticut. Have a class discussion about women in politics. Some questions to consider: What types of government positions do women mainly hold? What makes an effective politician? Are women effective in state government? Use specific examples.
